

13/14Ch Summer Term Curriculum Overview

This term pupils will be studying the following topics in their KS5 curriculum.

Subject	Topic
Music	13/14Ch will be forming duos and trios this term in order to use their rhythmic and melodic skills covered in terms 1 and 2. They will collaborate to form a list of songs that they would like to cover in small groups and we will work on further developing their performance skills. These will be performed in assemblies and for video reviews. We will also be experimenting with some new instruments such as the 'Tongue Drums' and Digital 'Launchpads'.
Healthy Living	WJEC unit: <i>Frequent and regular physical activity for health, fitness and wellbeing</i> . The group will be continuing to gather evidence that demonstrates they have engaged in a variety of physical fitness activities which have a direct effect on their health, fitness and wellbeing. They will then use this to build their personal evidence portfolios.
Literacy	In Literacy this term we will be learning about Classic Fairy Tales by Charles Perrault including Puss in Boots and Blue Beard. Through these stories we will be thinking about narration, characterisation, and learning about life in 17th-century France . Students will work on their sentence structure using a variety of adjectives to add information to a scene. Students will develop their comprehension of events within a story through retelling and answering questions.
Work Experience	Where appropriate students will be taking part in individual external work placements based on their skills and interests. These may include café work or catering, office work and retail. There is also the opportunity to work in the school's internal work placements in the canteen and library.
Enterprise	Look at examples of other crafters recycling and making tie & dye, marbling, batik and jewellery making Practise crafting skills and modelling skills to create an original items for sale. Use Twitter to advertise items made. Learn to recycle wood offcuts as tiny house ornaments and to make marbled paper, cut into elements to add to cards for sale
Computing	Some students will continue to prepare for an Edexcel ICT Functional Skills exam, This will include practicing on past papers, using Microsoft Word to open, edit and save documents, opening emails and extracting information from them, and editing Excel Files. Some Students will continue to learn that when a computer does something it is following instructions called Code. They will write, or program, their own Code and create their own

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	basic games and apps. They will learn to work logically; systematically identify mistakes and De-Bug their Code.
Numeracy	This term there will be further work on telling the time, and practical problems related to this. We will also continue to work on fractions, including decimals and use of money. We will also continue to reinforce understanding of number, particularly addition and subtraction.
Drama	Pupils will build on current and develop new drama skills including teamwork, devising, improvisation, using physical theatre techniques and performance. Students to enact stories and scenes from Classic Fairy stories by Charles Perrault including Puss in Boots and Blue Beard. They will be working in small groups to create class performances using staging, lights and costume.
Citizenship	This term students will work towards WJEC Pathways "Religious and Moral Arguments about Contentious Issues". They will gain knowledge and understanding of the religious and moral arguments concerning a contentious contemporary issue of their choice.
Off-site PE	This terms offsite PE activity will be multisport. Students will use local parks for the lessons and take part in a variety of different sports to further develop their skills and confidence in PE. The majority of activities will be team based to give students the opportunity to work with others to achieve a target/ goal. Multi-sports will improve basic movement skills and potentially identify new emerging skills by taking part in a range of activities over the course of the term.
Art	Students will explore images created by many different artists and illustrators 'Art in Nature'. Looking at shapes, textures, patterns and colours, being inspired by reflections of fish in river water and sea creatures. We will be experimenting with a variety of art materials and completing our art sketch books.
Employability	Students will learn about what makes a successful interview through theory and practical. Students will learn about how to plan a journey using public transport, maps and timetables.
SoCo	This term pupils will continue work on the topic of giving and following instructions, based around the theme of the local environment. They will role play, and work variously in small groups or pairs.
