

13S Autumn Term Curriculum Overview

This term students will be studying the following topics in their KS5 curriculum

Subject	<u>Topic</u>
Functional Numeracy	Students will be working with number that can enhance their ability to deal with the world outside school. They will be working with money, time, timetables, and units of measure. They will carry out simulated shopping exercises.
English Exploring Advertising	This term 13S will be exploring the topic of advertising. Students will be exploring the purpose of advertising and the different types of advertising. All activities are linked to the accredited 'Entry Pathway for Additional English' Developing phonological awareness, spelling, and reading skill through Word-shark, Nussy, SWAP cards, and comprehension tasks.
Enterprise	This term we will be concentrating on making Christmas items to sell. Including handmade tree ornaments and decorations. The emphasis will be on using recycled materials as much as possible to keep initial costs down. Students will be expected to research and design their products within guidelines.
DRAMA	Devising and making a film. Students to use the camera, devise a story board and edit their footage. They will work together on every aspect of making and performing in a film.
Music	Garageband-songwriting-part 2- developing a song structure and incorporating elements of world music e.g. music from N.Africa & India/Pakistan
Art	Pathways entry level: Painting and Drawing. Explore and experiment with materials and processes to help develop art skills. Close observation drawings, mark making, printing, collage, colour mixing and painting skills. Research and record artists approach to nature.
Food Tech	In the second half of this term students will be running the Buff Bites café. They will be preparing and selling filled rolls, sandwiches, wraps and cupcakes to staff and students. The café project forms part of their Enterprise studies and contributes hands on experience in production, sales and finance.
Lambeth College Link Course	Students are working in the construction department at the Vauxhall site. Each term they study a different course in either painting and decorating, carpentry or bricklaying.

ICT	<p>First half –term: Students will move their learning on and expand on their knowledge of computer coding using Espresso Coding to produce their own games and applications.</p> <p>Second half-term: Students will continue to learn about E-safety and produce Calendars using Microsoft Publisher.</p>
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
