

14C Autumn Term Curriculum Overview

This term pupils will be studying the following topics in their KS5 curriculum.

Subject	Topic
Functional Numeracy	<p><u>Functional skills Maths and foundation Maths.</u> Baseline assessment. Revise number bonds to 10 and 20. Estimate and count to 10, 20, 50,100 and beyond. Learn inverse of add and minus. Identify sums of money. Use money in real life situations. Understand and read an analogue and digital clock. Associate, reading times with real life situations. Understand measure and mass. Read scales. Calculate area. Understand the unit of length and capacity. Learn to use a calculator.</p>
Functional Literacy	<p>Students to follow individually tailored programs of learning, with each lesson containing activities addressing the four target areas for development (reading, writing, memory, and phonological awareness); and with each activity being precisely differentiated to the needs of each student.</p> <p>Generally, each lesson will be structured so as to divide students into three groups: one following relevant ICT programs (eg. Nessy, wordshark and Educationcity) under staff supervision, and a third working one-to-one with the staff on other tasks relating to reading, writing, memory or phonological awareness tasks (eg. the Edith Norrie Letter-case, swap cards, the Comprehension box, LDA comprehension cards, or dictation); the groups to be rotated throughout each lesson, such that all areas are covered.</p>
Enterprise	<p>The Class will be making decorations and Christmas related products from recycled materials to sell at markets and in school.</p>
Music	<p>The class will continue to develop their skills and knowledge of computer software programs, such as 'GarageBand' on the Ipad, in order to create their own unique dance tracks and songs.</p>
Art	<p>This term we will continue to practise drawing, painting and collage skills. Students will be encouraged to research and record their ideas and images in their sketch books. There will be an emphasis on social communication skills.</p>
Food Tech	<p>This term the class will be developing their cooking and business skills by running an enterprise food stall selling different seasonal dishes to staff and students. The topic</p>

	includes aspects of marketing such as conducting surveys, advertising and customer service.
PE	<u>Off-Site PE</u> In this unit pupils use facilities in the local community to experience indoor and outdoor leisure activities. Taking into account interests of the students we promote positive attitudes towards an active and healthy lifestyle.
Work Experience	Students are participating in individualised work experience placements at a variety of venues including Roots & Shoots horticulture project, Harrisons and Just Hospitality catering, Clapham children's centre and The Ministry of Justice.
