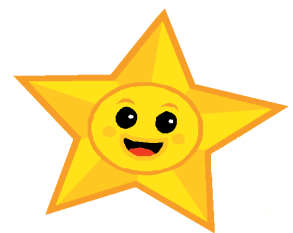
As part of the Enterprise scheme the pupils are recycling items, and then selling them, please see the back of this newsletter for a list of the items wanted.
