

Attendance last half term was good but no year groups reached our target attendance of 95%.

Year 12 were closest with 94%. Two form groups did meet the threshold with 11C at 97.4%, and 12C with 97.1%

Sickness: Autumn term can be difficult for attendance due to sickness bugs so we encourage good hygiene for all pupils and families e.g. hand washing and using tissues. This will help to reduce spread of any winter illnesses.

Guidance on Covid states that isolation periods for young people is 3 days if they test positive or is only necessary if pupil s have cold symptoms AND temperature. When temperatures return to normal pupils can return.

If pupils are well enough to come into school and don't have a temperature they should attend.
