

## Parent Survey Feedback



Parent Questionnaire Results - July 2022

It is clear to see that the majority of responses were positive, with parents strongly agreeing (dark green) or agreeing (light green).

Respondents this year strongly support the school values: Fairness, Kindness, Equality and Respect, which is a new question with 99% of respondents strongly / agreeing.

Respondents were also strongly in agreement that staff expect their children to work hard and do their best, with 98% strongly / agreeing. This is higher than previous years (2019: 95%, 2018: 96%, 2017: 93%).

They also strongly / agreed (98%) that the school is well led and managed, this is higher than 2019 (97%) and 2017 (96%), but slightly lower than 2018 (99%).

Respondents strongly / agreed that their child is cared for and safe (98%). This the same as the previous questionnaires in 2019, 2016 and 2014 and higher than previous years (97% in 2018 and 2017) but lower than 2015 (100%).

Respondents also feel comfortable about approaching the school with a problem or complaint, with 97% strongly / agreeing. This is slightly only lower than the previous questionnaire in 2019 (98%) and 2015 and 2016 (99%). It is the same as 2018 and 2017.
