

Highshore Accreditation 2021-22 – Impact Report

Overview

In 2021-22, it was possible for the school to resume its accreditation programme after the prolonged disruption caused by the Covid Pandemic.

Selected pupils in Key Stage 4 and 5 were entered for Pearson's Edexcel Functional Skills Qualifications as well as some WJEC Entry Pathways units. A total of 57 pupils were entered for one or more accreditation, with 31 from KS4 and 26 from KS5. There was an added emphasis on supporting school leavers to achieve accreditations after 2 years of disruption.

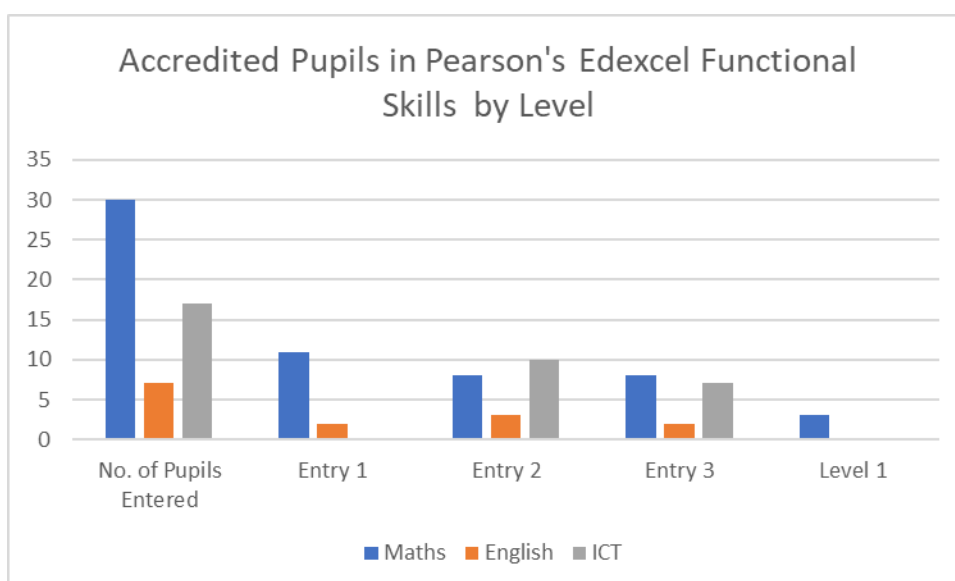
Results

Pearsons/ Edexcel Level 1 Functional Skills

Pleasingly, the school was able, for the first time, to support 3 students in achieving a Level 1 Maths qualification, equivalent to a lower level GCSE (grades D to G, or 3 to 1). After this initial success, there are plans to continue to offer this higher-level accreditation with some more able pupils already identified.
