


Crafts, sensory play and storytelling in a more relaxed environment

So far this academic year whole school attendance is 89.3% which is below the attendance level set by the DfE for Special schools. As you can see by the graph above shows that our year 12 pupils have highest attendance with 93.5%

Last term we started our awards for best attendance by class.
