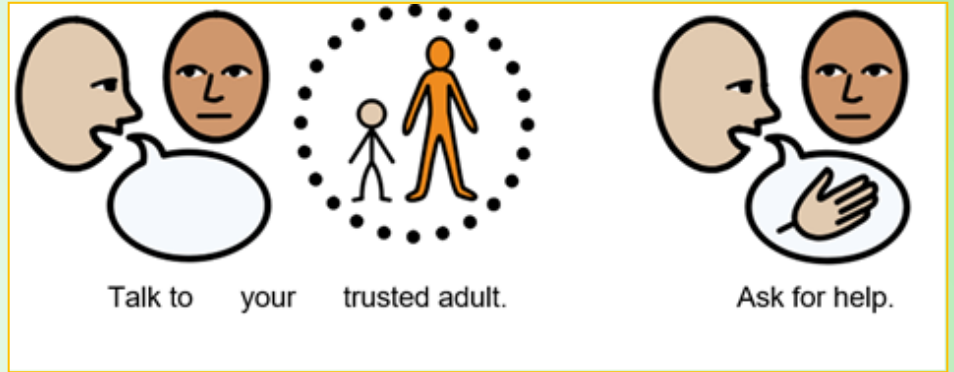

# Safeguarding Bulletin



## Safeguarding Bulletin: Sharing inappropriate images

The NSPCC (National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children) refers to the sharing of inappropriate images as 'sharing nudes'. The NSPCC uses this term to describe a range of different types of behaviours related to the sharing of images or video's online of a person who might be undressed or partly undressed. The sharing of inappropriate images could be consensual or non-consensual, sexual or non-sexual.

Sometimes people chose to share images of themselves, for example when they feel they are in a happy and safe relationship, however, this is against the law. This is sometimes known as "sexting". Sharing nudes is illegal for people under the age of 18 because once a young person has shared an image, they no longer have control over how the image is used and the law is trying to protect you and keep you safe from harm.

Once shared, an image may be shared more widely around peer groups (for example on WhatsApp, or Snap Chat) without a person's knowledge or consent, which could lead to bullying, humiliation or isolation or feelings of shame. People might use those images illegally, to blackmail a person. For example, they might force them to give them money or do things that they do not want to do.

While some people chose to share images, often people are put under pressure by peers to take and share nude images of themselves, even though this might make them feel really frightened, scared, anxious or ashamed. It might give them a nasty feeling in their tummy and they might regret it immediately.

Sometimes young people are groomed or manipulated by adults and put under pressure to share images of themselves. It is illegal for any adult to engage in any form of sexual activity with a person under the age of 16 whether online or offline. This is a form of abuse and you should let a trusted adult know immediately if an adult ever asks you to share images with them.

Often people are sent pictures or videos they did not want or consent to see and this can be shocking and upsetting.

People can also be photographed or videoed without their knowledge or consent. This can lead to pictures or videos being circulated that they did not know existed.

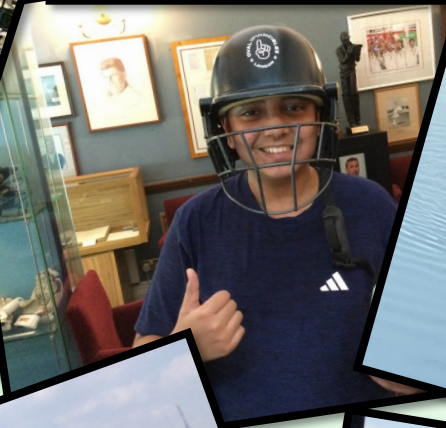
Remember: In the UK, it is against the law to take, make, show, distribute or possess a nude image or video of a child under the age of 18.

If someone ever sends you a nude image (either of themselves or somebody else) you should delete it immediately. You should never send it to someone else as this could cause someone real harm and distress. You will also be breaking the law.

If someone asks you to send them an image you should say 'no, I am not comfortable with that'. If someone has asked you to send them an image and this is making you feel worried, frightened or upset, or they are bothering you, you should tell a trusted adult such as your parent or carer or your teacher as soon as you can. They can help you, for example by showing you how to block the person on your phone or by calling the police.

## Step 6: Book Appointments (Automatic)

## Step 7: Book Appointments

Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signify where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable.
