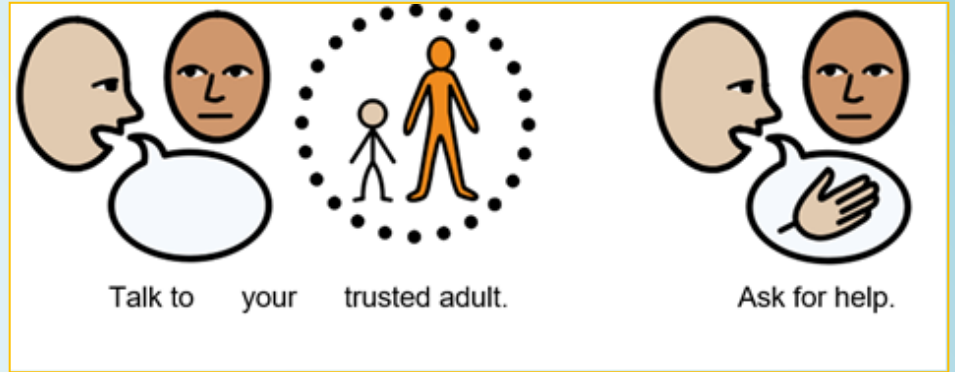

Safeguarding Bulletin: Sharing inappropriate images

Remember: In the UK, it is against the law for anyone under the age of 18 to share nude images, whether of themselves or somebody else. Sharing nudes is illegal for people under the age of 18 because once a young person has shared an image, they no longer have control over how the image is used, and the law is trying to protect you and keep you safe from harm.

It is always illegal for anyone to take, make, show, distribute, or possess a nude image or video of a child under the age of 18.

If someone asks your child to send them an image of themselves, they should say, 'No, I am not comfortable with that'. We want all children who are made to feel worried, frightened, or upset online to feel able to tell a trusted adult, such as their parent, carer, or their teacher as soon as they can. You can reassure your child by thanking them for telling you what has happened to them online and letting them know that you will help them by showing them how to block the person or by calling the police.
